The disinfection used, (name) is officially recognised as effective against viruses, and the recommended contact time of the disinfectant was observed.</p> <p>the container must bear on the outside of the container the unique certificate ID number that corresponds with the ID number provided for on the accompanying health certificate.</p> <p>the containers and/or transport is designed to prohibit the discharge of bedding, faeces and liquid, with capacity sufficient for the intended journey.</p> <p>(*) Keep as appropriate.</p>
